CHAIRPERSON REPORT 2019 LAUNCH Clintons Toyota, Campbelltown 21 June 2019

It's a pleasure to officially Launch the 24 Hr Fight Against Cancer Macarthur campaign for 2019 – for this, our 15th year. It's fitting that we are here at Clinton's Toyota in Campbelltown who are a Foundation sponsor and have been on board since Day 1.

Thank you ladies and gentleman for leaving your busy lives and businesses and taking the time to be here this morning. Your interest in being a part of the 24Hr 'Family' is what makes this great charity so successful.

Just like a family, we have grown over our 15 years together. There's been many changes, we've lost people we love and we've welcomed new people into the fold, but what is constant is that we have remained a grassroots volunteer organisation.

With your help, we have worked hard to improve the services available for local people with cancer receiving treatment at the Macarthur Cancer Therapy Centre, the Oncology Ward and the Paediatric Ambulatory Care Unit both at Campbelltown Hospital and the Palliative Care Unit and its outreach services at Camden Hospital.

One of the main purposes of a launch is to report to the community on what we achieved last year.

I'm extremely proud to announce that in 2018 the 24Hr Fight Against Cancer Macarthur raised **\$300,000** bringing the total raised since 2005 to **\$4.3million**. In this economic climate, the achievements of our community have been outstanding.

For a local, not for profit organisation, totally run by volunteers – this is amazing. It was possible because of the support from all of you - our local business sponsors, service organisations and the very generous Macarthur community.

As a business person and a family man, I understand that there are many worthy causes that you would like to support, but there is a limit to how much you can do.

Our founder, Fred Borg OAM clearly understood that people would support an organisation where every dollar donated is put to work locally, helping cancer patients in our Campbelltown and Camden hospitals. 100% for Macarthur – By Macarthur. Fred Borg was a great man who demonstrated passion and commitment to this cause. We miss him greatly and we work hard to ensure his legacy lives on.

The contribution that 24Hr funding has made to local people dealing with cancer is immeasurable. We have provided a range of medical equipment, staffing and support resources during 2018. I can't list every thing but some notable examples include:

- A new fully accessible patient transport bus costing approximately \$80,000. There it is – isn't it beautiful?

It replaces our previous bus purchased in 2011 which had travelled 300,00kms in Macarthur and delivered thousands of patients to chemotherapy and radiation treatment. We thank Clintons Toyota for negotiating the best price for us.

- Extra occupational therapy time and equipment for the Lymphoedema Clinic. This extra support will greatly reduce waiting time and allow patients to get help from this serious and painful condition which can follow cancer surgery. We will hear more from our guest speaker, Deanna Applitt about this soon.

- Six recliner chair/beds for the Palliative Care Ward at Camden Hospital valued at over \$2000 each. These chairs will allow family and friends to spend important final time together with their loved ones in greater comfort.
- The continuation of wellness programs for cancer patients through the ENRICH program. This program provides a dietician and physiotherapist to assist patients with exercise programs. Again, the results have been reported as outstanding. Nicholas and Athena Borg, sponsors from Macarthur Natural Health also provide massage and acupuncture treatments for patients.

It's important to remember that **NONE of these things** were available from any other source. They are all **EXTRAS** that help to make our local cancer services one of the forerunners in patient care in the State.

We continue to be able to fund **100% of the requests** made to us and Dr Stephen Della Fiorentina will be able to tell us later what that means in terms of patient care.

It's important that today we acknowledge all those groups that make these results possible. Firstly, our **hardworking committee**.

Behind the scenes, there are endless hours of personal time given by each and every member to ensuring that all of our events run smoothly. I'd like to thank them, new and old, for the skills they bring and for their willingness to give from the heart – often without recognition or reward.
